PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE...

Dear Parents,

This year from 6 - 12 March 2016, all Catholic schools in the Parramatta Diocese will celebrate Catholic Schools Week (CSW).

Dioceses across NSW and the ACT are joining together to celebrate the theme for CSW 2016 which is 'I Belong, You Belong. We Belong.' The theme aligns with the Church's mission to support refugees and asylum seekers and the need to foster a more compassionate global community. The CSW theme and our compassion for those seeking safety on our shores, also ties in with the global Catholic Church celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy which centres on pardon, strength and love.

In this Year of Mercy, Pope Francis is calling on all Catholic communities to extend mercy to those in need, particularly refugees. "Faced with the tragedy of tens of thousands of refugees fleeing death on account of war and hunger and who are travelling toward a hope of life, the Gospel calls us to be 'neighbours' to the smallest and abandoned and to give them a concrete hope," Pope Francis said.

During Catholic Schools Week, schools will be opening their doors and showcasing the themes of belonging and mercy in action. Catholic Schools Week is also about strengthening relationships between all those that have a stake in our schools – students, staff, families, priests, parishioners, and members of the wider community – by showcasing what happens in our schools every day.

It is important to celebrate and strengthen the close relationship between school and parish, and it is for this reason that parishioners from Holy Name of Mary are encouraged to connect with St Mary's Primary and visit us for during our 'Learning in Action' morning which will follow Mass on Friday 11th March.

We look forward to welcoming new and existing families along with members of the Parish to our school next week.

VISITOR KIOSK


A new sign in iPad has been installed in the foyer of the office. This is for all volunteers and contractors visiting our site. All schools in the Diocese are receiving these Visitor Kiosks where all visitors to the site will be required to 'sign in'. Once signed in the visitor is provided with a printed visitors badge that includes a photo and information about the person you are visiting (usually the classroom teacher you will be working with). This replaces the paper sign in sheets and provides the office with a record of who is on the site at any time and would be used in the event of an evacuation etc. The first time you sign in there are some additional details recorded but for following visits you are only required to complete your name and a phone number. Thank you in advance for your assistance as we move to this new signing in procedure.

Thank you to those families that have been making every effort to have their children at school, ready for learning, every school day. A reminder that children need to arrive for school before 8.50am each day. Remember every day counts!

All schools fees have now been sent out by CEO. The due date for payment is Monday 7th March. If you are having problems with the payment of fees, please see Kate in the office.



SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN 2016

Below is another reminder of the dates for the Sacraments for this year:

RECONCILIATION - Children must be in Year 3 or above. Parent Night: 5th April – 7.30pm. Celebration of Sacrament: 30th June – 7.30pm.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - Children must be in Year 3 or above and have made their First Reconciliation. Parent Night: 5th April – 7.30pm. Masses for First Holy Communion – Sundays 21st & 28th August – 12.00pm

CONFIRMATION - Children must be in Year 5 and have made their other sacraments. Parent Night: 2nd August – 7.30pm. Mass for Confirmation: 21st October – 7.30pm.

All other relevant dates, such as Enrolments, session times etc., are in a handout at the back of the church.
