New Law change gives the green light for teenagers to ride on footpaths. As students return from the winter holidays, they will no longer have to navigate traffic on busy roads while riding their bikes to school. Children aged up to 16-years-old are now legally allowed to ride on footpaths, after the NSW government overhauled regulations that forced children off footpaths and onto roads once they turned 12-years-old. 
