PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE...

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Ever thought of being a saint? No? Not for you? Probably, one person who was declared as a saint in 2010 never thought of being a saint either. St Mary Mackillop was declared a Saint on 17th October in that year. St Mary had uncommon kindness and is an example to us not to forget those people who are the "forgettables" in our world.

The saints are always calling us back to our Christian roots. They are real human beings like us with their own personal problems but who battle on to achieve extraordinary deeds. Because of this, we should not leave them as lifeless statues or stained-glass windows and excuse ourselves from our responsibilities to other people on the pretext that we aren't perfect. The very fact that they are human like us, is a reminder to us of our responsibilities even if we are flawed and imperfect persons.

The following two observations highlight the "ordinary person" of St Mary Mackillop: "We want our saints to be inspiring but to understand the pathways we walk. Mary is a model of human possibility and she worked with what she had available to her and made things happen in a practical, humanly sensitive way." Sister Carroll. "The real Mary Mackillop was, in her youth, a rather photogenic, nice nun who grew up to be a remarkable woman of toughness and imagination in the way she lived her faith. But she was also an old lady in a wheelchair nursing her little dog after her active days were over." Fr Tony Kelly.

Not everyone can be a Mary Mackillop, but we can all do something, if only of a minor nature, to improve the quality of life of disadvantaged and neglected people. The world needs more saints in the making, so that question again: Ever thought of being a saint?

St Mary Mackillop of Australia, may the spirit of your life live on in the lives of Christian people right now. May we, ordinary people like you, be inspired to reach out to needy people as you did. May God's Spirit be powerful in us as it was in the both of you. We particularly remember the children of our Parish who will be confirmed and who are called to be Saints in our prayers this week. Amen.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR

As you know we have a school wide goal of student attendance being 92% and through the winter months we managed an average attendance of 92%. **CONGRATULATIONS!**

Our staff are encouraging each other and the students to "finish strong" this year using the analogy of a Marathon Runner ... Stephen MR Covey talks about when worldclass marathon runners 'hit the wall' and they feel like they can't go on. Instead of focusing on their exhaustion and how tired they are feeling and going into the 'survival shuffle', they lift up their head and pick up the pace. I believe this is a vital mind set for us all in schools at this time of the year. By picking up the pace, you are really saying to yourself that you're not just going to finish. you're going to finish strong! So I encourage students to be at school every school day not to extend weekends to long ones, not to have a day off because we are tired - but to stay home only when sick - and finish the year strong!
