Dear Parents,

### CHANGE OF HOME OR EMERGENCY CONTACT DETAILS

### **STAFFING**

Mrs Gosper will be taking a short period of Long Service Leave for the last two weeks of this term and the first three days of Term 3. Miss Boidin will be Acting Assistant Principal for this period. Miss Tomasic and Mrs Clarkson will work with Mrs Gosper's Reading Recovery and EMU students during this time. We welcome Mrs Eva Turkington, an experienced teacher who is familiar with our school, who will release these teachers during Mrs Gosper's leave. We wish Mrs Gosper a safe trip during her leave.

#### DAYS ABSENT REPORTS

As you know reports will be sent home at the end of next week and in one section of the report the number of days absent for the first half of the year is listed. I am often asked about the number of days absent as parents wonder 'how many days off is too many'? The evidence is very clear about school attendance – <u>every day counts</u>. We know that from time to time illness and unexpected events will prevent students from attending school but on the whole children need to be at school at every opportunity. As a guide – multiply the number of days absent on this report by 14 (being the number of reports you will receive during their Primary years) – this will be the number of days (at this rate) that your child will miss in his or her Primary schooling – there are about 200 days in a school year – <u>so 100 absences is the equivalent of half a year of lost learning</u> – which might answer the question 'how many is too many'?

#### **VOLUNTEER TRAINING**

'Building Child Safe Communities' is an initiative developed by Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta. It is a requirement that all volunteers must complete an online 'undertaking form' that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering at schools. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

The Child Protective Training module is a compulsory two-step process for all volunteers working in our schools and can be accessed via the following link: <a href="http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au">http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au</a> Click onto VOLUNTEERS. Complete STEP 1-Volunteer Form - Complete online. STEP 2-Training Module Read through the presentation then complete and submit the quiz questions. After successful completion of both steps, two notifications will be sent via email to the school and also to the volunteer's email address. The Volunteer Form and Training Module will remain valid for two years.
