PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

For many years we have implemented our Positive Behaviour and Student Management Policy which is supported by programmes such as "You Can Do It". These programmes and policies are built on positive discipline – the features of which can be used at home...

It is inevitable that everyone in the house is more anxious and worried as families navigate the uncertainties of the pandemic. Younger children will struggle to articulate so are more likely to act out their stress or anxiety, while older children and teens can be miserable as they miss out on normal events and the activities they enjoy with their friends. Here are some ways you can help your children manage their emotions and behaviour:



Redirect bad behaviour. Sometimes children misbehave because they are bored or are unsure how they should behave. Help them find something else to do.

Creative Play. Help with ideas; build an indoor fort to keep germs at bay and fill it with stuffed animals or, use drawings of the ways your family is staying safe then construct a collage to remind everyone.

Use rewards and privileges to encourage completion of homework and assignments as well as household chores.

Reinforce good behaviours by how you direct your attention. Notice good behaviour and effort, pointing it out and explaining clear expectations.

Choose when not to respond. Sometimes ignoring bad behaviour is the most effective way of stopping it. Just ensure it is not dangerous behaviour.

Time-outs can be effective especially when delivered unemotionally after warnings. Remove the child from the situation for a pre-set length of time. (1 minute per year of age may be a good guide).

Set aside **special time with each child** for activities such as cooking, reading, or playing a favourite game. You choose the time and let your child choose the activity. Just 20 minutes of undivided attention can make a big difference.

Finally, remember to take care of yourself as the caregiver. If both parents are at home share the load and give each other time out. Sleep, eat and exercise as well as you can to ensure your ability to keep the home a happy and positive place.

DRIVER AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY AROUND THE SCHOOL

I have written on numerous occasions about the need for drivers, in particular, to follow both the road rules and school procedures when driving near the school. Too often, when I speak with drivers about their behaviour the response is "I did not know...". In summary – please put safety first and not your convenience.

- **Do not drop your child off near gate 8** – ONLY drop off in the Kiss and Go area.
- **Do not do a U turn in a School Zone**
- **Do not enter the Kiss and Go line from Myrtle Street**
- **Do not queue in Pine Street waiting for space in Kiss and Go**
- **Do not park behind the pub**
- **ONLY cross your child at marked crossings**



Storm by Alex

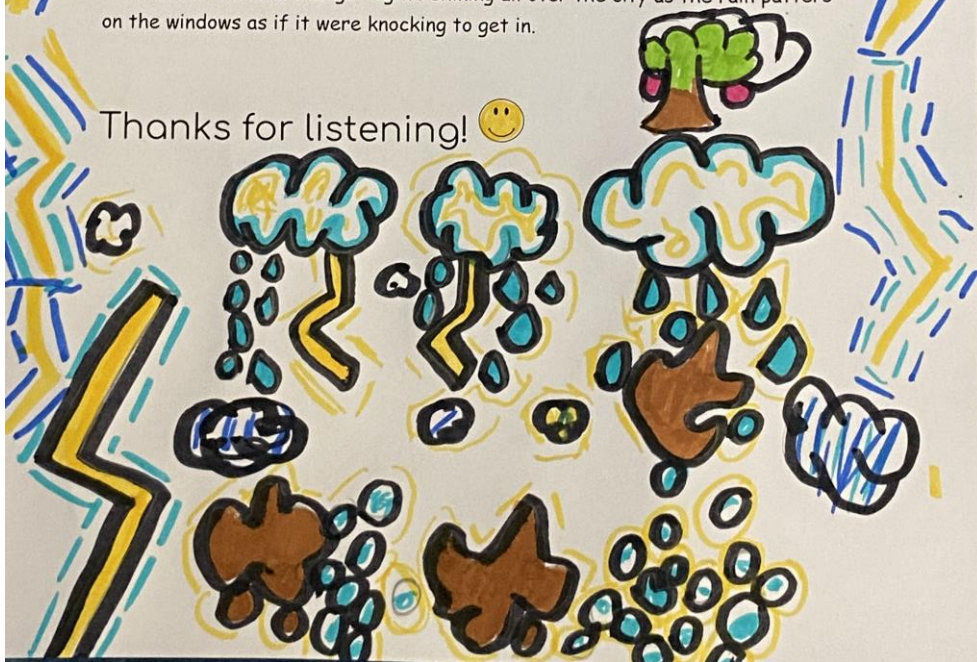
