Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This report gives the family a general indication of how your child is progressing in all 7 Key Learning Areas that the students study. The allocating of a grade, A to E, is a legislative requirement and reflects a dated and simplistic view of learning. Hopefully, this will change in the future but unfortunately it is the system in which we function today.

The core of the report is seen in the Religion comment, English comment, Mathematics comment and General comment along with the effort grade, personal traits and study habits. 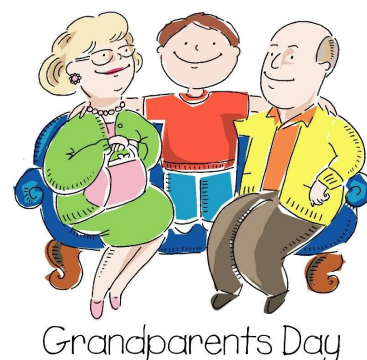
### RECENT GRANDPARENT DEATHS

## TECHNOLOGY UPDATE...

This term Stage 2 have been lucky enough to have the support of Chris Maguire the Specialist Teacher - Digital Technologies from the Learning Exchange at the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta.



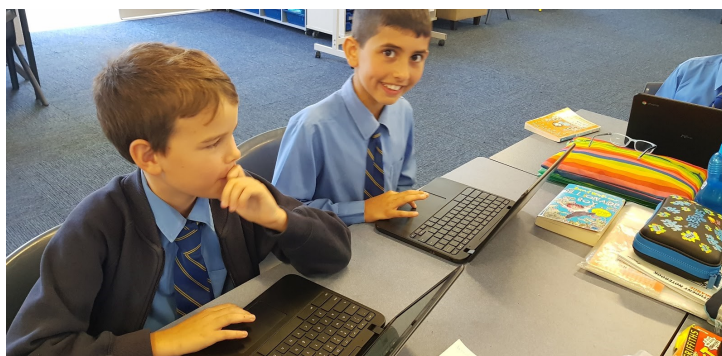
Stage 2 were supplied with 60 Chromebooks at the end of last year by CEDP and the Stage 2 teachers engaged in professional learning about how to use them to enhance student learning. In Term 2 Mr Maguire came into the classroom for 5 Mondays and worked directly with students.

Students had the opportunity to explore their Google drive and in particular Google Classroom.

We now have many experts in the room and working together with Mr Maguire was not only interesting, fun and exciting but really helped develop a collaborative spirit amongst students.

Students learned to:

- Identify the shortcut keys used on a Chromebook.
- Bookmark key learning sites on their bookmarks bar (Classroom, Drive, Gmail).
- Explore useful extensions and add to Chrome.
- Use a variety of extensions to support their learning.
- Complete and submit work on Google Classroom.
- Use Screencastify to make video submissions, explanations and give feedback.
- Use different Google docs.



Stage 2 have had a lot of fun learning about this new technology this term. It has been a really great help to our learning and we are all excited to have the chance to put our new skills into practise.
