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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE...

Dear Parents

Soon after children are born, they are inoculated against diseases such as diphtheria, whooping cough and measles. Their parents and their local community regard them as precious and act on their behalf to assist their safe passage through infancy and childhood. As they progress towards adulthood, they take on more responsibility for their own health needs.

Likewise, at infant Baptism, parents, Godparents and the local Christian community speak out on behalf of the child as the gifts of the Holy Spirit are bestowed on the child. The adults pledge to assist the spiritual development of the child until a personal response is awakened and responsibility is accepted to exercise the gifts of the Spirit in their own life.

Some time ago Life Magazine carried a beautiful photograph of a mother's hand reaching out in love to embrace her newborn baby. It could be said that when a child is baptised the hand of God's love reaches out to embrace the baby and to bestow upon it the expression of His love.

It is in this way that Baptism makes us members of God's family and as such we are all related to each other and responsible for each other. Through Baptism each of us is attached to Christ; we become an extension of Christ. We become other 'Christs' in the world; Christ is now present in the world through us.

The Sacraments are ways that God visibly loves us during our journey on earth. Our Christian journey begins at Baptism with a call from God to live the Gospel through the actions of our lives. We join a community of faith learners who support one another in a life that is not static but is a continual movement towards making real, Christ's message to our local world.

Baptism is God's gift to us; it is called gift because it is given to us who bring nothing of our own. So, what have we done with our gift? Have we simply left it unopened and so are unaware of its value to us in life. Hopefully, we have not allowed this to happen to our children's "gift".

Because we answered on behalf of our children when they were baptised, there is an emphasis on the importance of faithfulness on our part. In asking to have our children baptised we accepted the responsibility of training them in the practice of their faith. This calls for Christian modelling on our behalf. We are to be strong models to our children as they journey to their own adulthood.

Special congratulations and welcome to Joshua Tenorio (5LV) on his recent Baptism. Please keep Joshua and the Flint Family (Mum, Robbie and James) who will be baptised at Easter, in your prayers.

HAIR CUTS

Recently we were asked what a number 0, number 1 and number 2 hair cut for boys looked like. We have the following image to assist families with this question. Our Uniform Policy states that "For boys, 0 or number 1 hair cuts, rat's tails, mullets etc, hair gel and hair colouring are not acceptable. Hair length for boys must be above their collars. Girls are to wear their hair tied back in a pony tail or plait and no hair colourings or streaks are permitted." Lines etc, cut into a number 2, shapes etc are not permitted. Hair should be blended when moving from a shorter cut to a longer hair cut to avoid steps and noticeable transitions. Fringes should be not be in children's eyes. Thank you for your support of our Uniform Policy.


SCHOOL FEE'S


LITERACY...
