ATTENDANCE

It is so important that all children are at school every day. Routines can help. These include:

TEACHERS ARE LEARNERS TOO

As you know apart from planning learning and teaching experiences, our staff are learners too. This week, for example three staff (Mrs Rheinberger, Miss Menday and Miss Elias) have been attending the "Foundations Project Based Learning" professional learning experience with educators from Texas. Recently all the teachers from Kindergarten to Year 2 have begun their year long professional learning in Mathematics in association with Monash University which included a full day off site learning day. This will be supported with further days of learning both at school and off site. These two examples demonstrate the commitment to ongoing professional learning our staff have as learners themselves.
